Commonwealth of Massachusetts
To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting

I, George N. Briggs, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, one of the United States of America, do hereby Request all whom it may concern, to permit safely and freely to pass Enoch Burnett of Belchertown a Citizen of the said Commonwealth, going to California and Elsewhere and in case of need, to give him all lawful aid and protection.

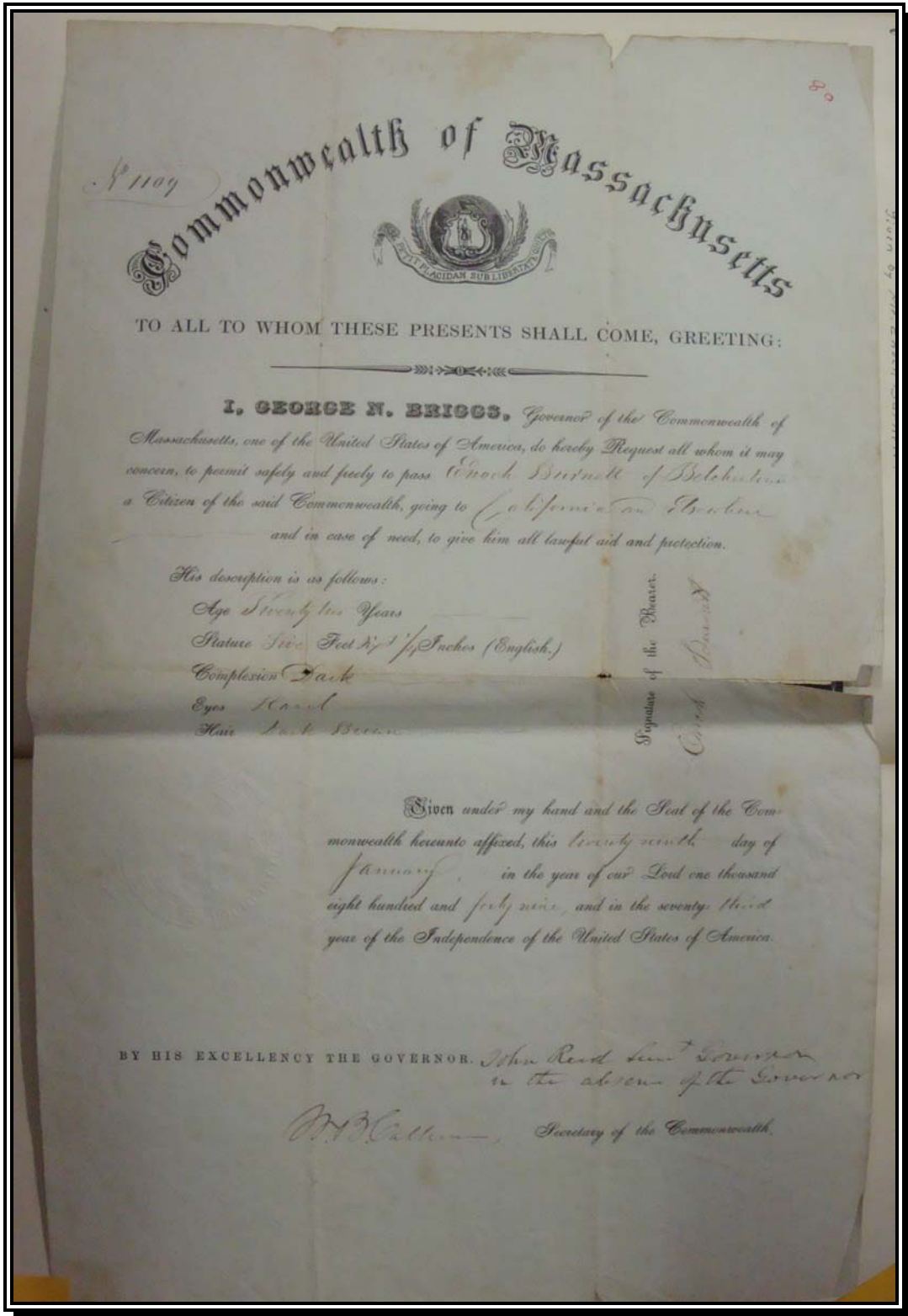
His description is as follows:

Hair Dark Brown

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth hereunto affixed, this twenty-ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, and in the seventy-third year of the Independence of the United States of America.

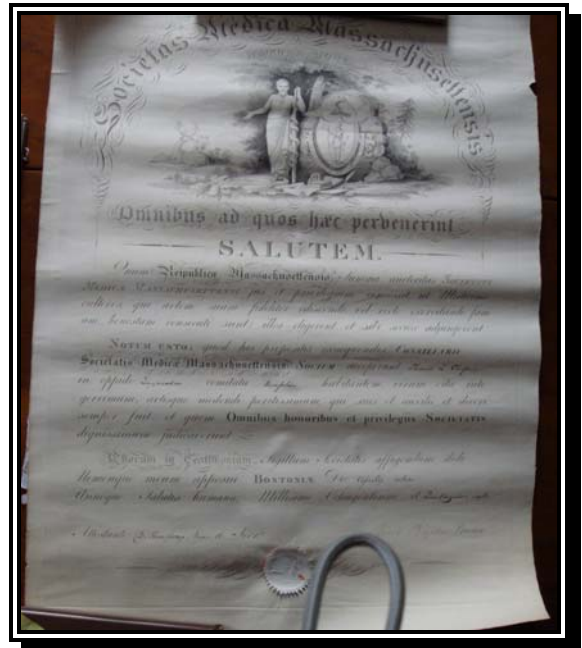

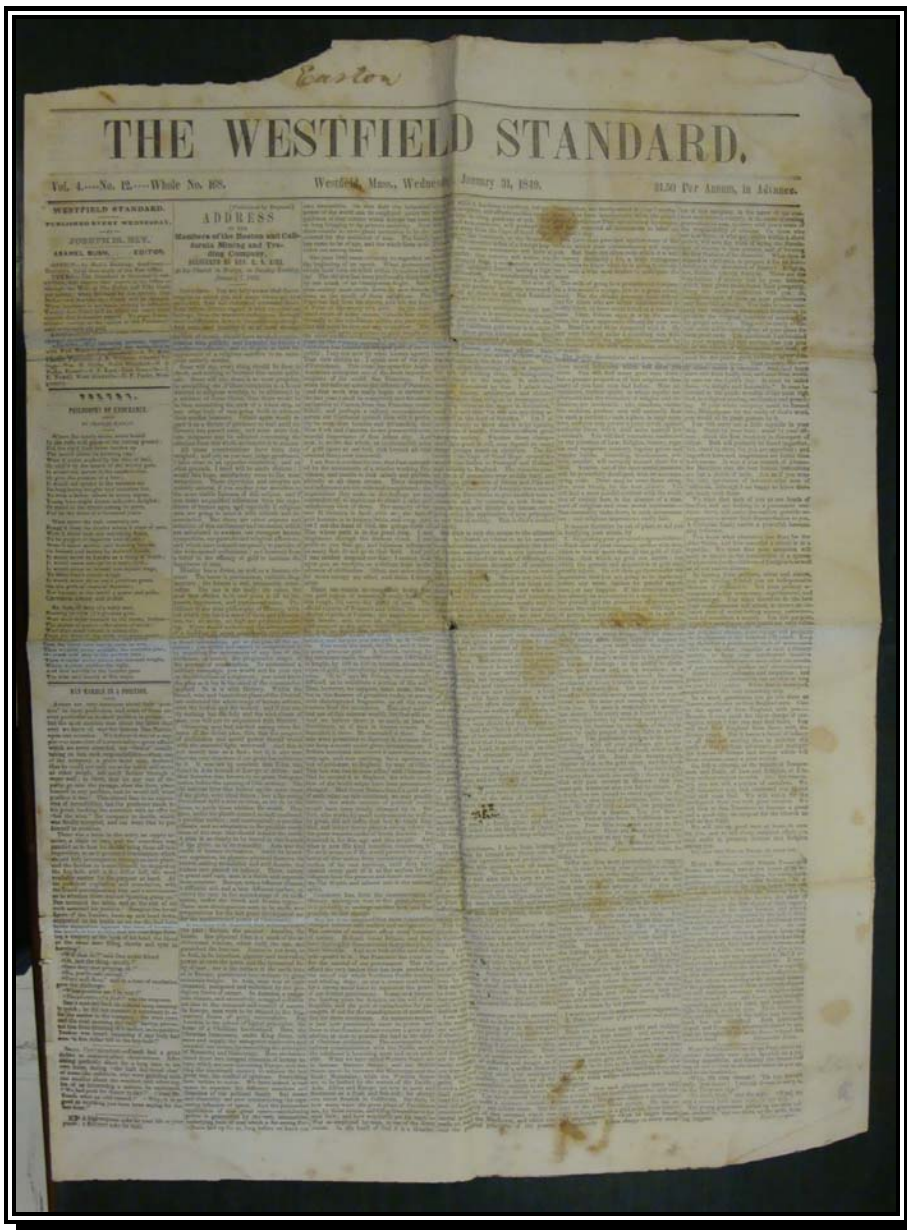
